DNA History

Since 1998, DNA has supported community members and helped build a vibrant neighborhood in a variety of ways including:

- ◆ Creating the Dogpatch Historic District
- ◆ Saving Esprit Park from development
- ◆ Helping to close the polluting Potrero Power Plant.
- ◆ Supporting grassroots neighborhood efforts like the Dogpatch Hub, Tunnel Top Park, Woods Yard Playground and the formation of the Green Benefit District.
- ◆ Prevented the split of Dogpatch from Potrero in 2022 redistricting.



DNA's Current Efforts:

DNA works to develop our community's civic capital with the energy of our growing neighborhood to further achieve our cause: fostering friendly association among Dogpatch neighbors while preserving the unique character of Dogpatch.

Right now we are working on...

- * Designing a permanent MinneSLOWta street.
- * Improving Amazon Corp's behavior in the operation of 888 Tennessee warehouse & expansion in our community.
- * Clarifying Life-Science zoning to protect PDR and UMU warehouses with OEWD & Planning
- * Holding UCSF accountable for promised payment of cushioning fees for 777 Mariposa + "Good Neighbor" standards.





Board Commitment:

- ◆ Board terms are for two years.
- ◆ Attend monthly 90 min board calls and monthly DNA membership meetings.
- ◆ Attend at least two community events each year and be available for phone/email consultations.
- ◆ Actively participate in the work of at least one board committee or board task force and attend at least 75% of its meetings.
- ◆ Review information if distributed prior to board meetings and be prepared to offer insight into matters of which the prospective board member has specialized knowledge or experience.
- ◆ Make every effort to fulfill one’s board term.

Committees:

Development & Private Infrastructure: Responsible for interface with developers of new construction projects. This committee works in coordination with the Potrero Boosters Development Committee.

Membership: Responsible for recruitment, engagement and retention of members, connectivity within the community, and building new relationships with neighborhood organizations.

Transportation & Livable Streets: Responsible for coordinating transportation issues between the City. This committee works in coordination with the Potrero Boosters Transportation and Livable Streets Committee.

Ad Hoc Committees: Established to accomplish short-term, specific projects. Examples: Homeless Issues; Slow Streets.
