How many students do we serve?

Last school year, 2021-22, we served a total of: **5,682** students in **3,726** program hours! and produced **33** Publications

with the support of:

719 volunteers

volunteering an average of **17.5 hours** a year each for an average student-to-tutor ratio of **3:1**



Who are our students?

All of our programs are offered free of charge and predominantly serve students of color and English Learners from under-resourced communities.

Black, African American: 9.6%

Asian, Asian American: 5.9%

White: 4%

Two or more races: 8.5%


